The English language is to be used in all communications. The <u>International Maritime Organisation's Standard Marine Communication Phrases (SMCP)</u> will be used.

These are the International Marine VHF Channels as used by the VTS in Malta:

- Unless otherwise instructed, vessels are to use VHF Channel 16 for Distress and Safety Calling.
- Ship-to-ship communication is to be made on VHF Channels other than those used by VTS.
- Where possible, vessels should use "low power" (1 watt) to reduce the range of the signal so as to prevent the channel being cluttered.

## Procedure:

Vessels calling to receive a service within territorial waters but outside port shall call Valletta VTS for instructions. Unless otherwise instructed by Valletta VTS, vessels approaching Valletta Grand Harbour shall enter or leave between the following coordinates:

Channel 70 is exclusively for DSC calling for safety and emergency and must not be used for other purposes.

These channels correspond to the international maritime mobile frequencies in the VHF band, as defined in the General Authorisations (Radiocommunications Apparatus) Regulations (S.L. 399.40).
