Drilling Works for Geotechnical Investigations off Enemalta Quay, Marsaxlokk.

The Ports and Yachting Directorate, Transport Malta, notifies mariners that drilling works for geotechnical investigations will be carried out off the Enemalta Quay in Marsaxlokk Harbour.

These works will be carried in the area A, B, C, D and the intermediate coastline as shown on the attached chart and in approximate positions:

	LATITUDE (N)	LONGITUDE (E)
A	35° 49.912'	14° 33.283'
B	35° 49.753'	14° 32.991'
C	35° 49.204'	14° 33.095'
D	35° 49.265'	14° 33.520'

Weather permitting the works are expected to commence with immediate effect and completed by Friday 30 August 2013.

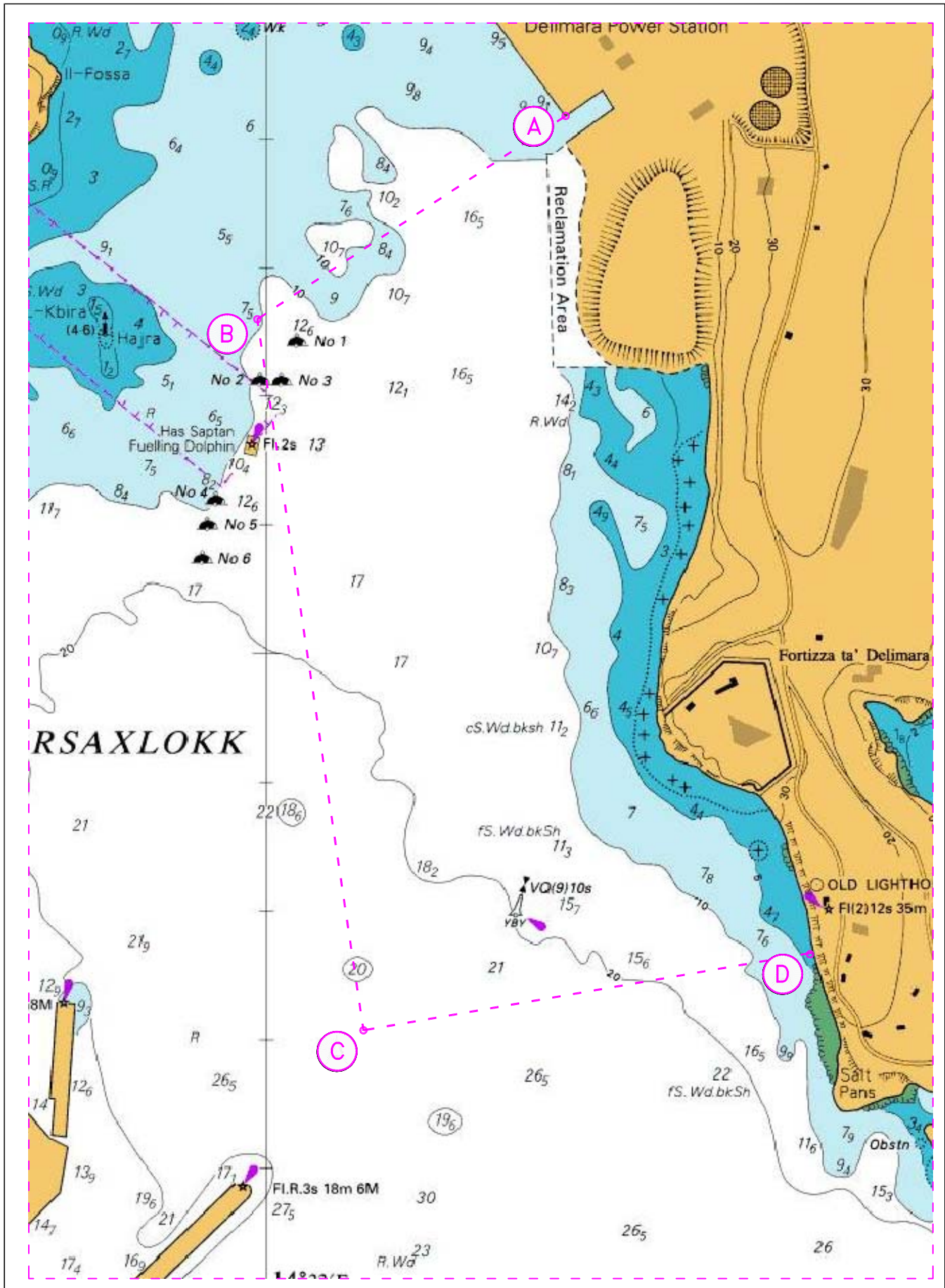
They will be carried out from a flat barge which will be accompanied by a small tug boat. The barge may deploy anchors to hold it in position and may remain in the area during the night.

Further more mariners and operators of vessels are advised to keep a sharp lookout, proceed at very slow speed and give the above area a wide berth of at least 300 meters.

Instructions given by Marsaxlokk Port Control (VTS) on VHF Channel 14 are to be complied with.
