## Infrastructure Malta - Propping up of bridge in Vittoriosa

The Ports and Yachting Directorate, Transport Malta notifies Mariners that Infrastructure Malta will start works to prop up the bridge between St. Angelo Wharf and Vittoriosa Wharf in Vittoriosa in the Grand Harbour (shown hatched in red on attached chart).

The work will start on Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> February 2020 and be completed by Friday 28<sup>th</sup> February 2020.

For these works a safety distance of 25m from the bridge is to be maintained during these works (shown in blue on attached chart). A silt curtain will be laid within this 25m safety distance therefore passage under the bridge will not be possible.

These works will include the use of vessels/barges/workboats and divers.

Further information about operating restrictions are to be obtained from Transport Malta and coordinated with the contractors on site. Further details about these works can be obtained from Infrastructure Malta on <u>info.im@infrastructuremalta.com</u>.

Mariners are also advised to keep a sharp lookout, navigate with caution and very slow speed (no wake) and give the indicated areas a wide berth. They are to comply with any instructions given by Valletta Port Control (Valletta VTS) on VHF Channel 12 and Enforcement Personnel on site.
